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OVERVIEW: Pursuant to 2 CFR § 200.201, OMB is allowing Federal awarding agencies the authority to grant the following exceptions to recipients affected by the pandemic as they deem appropriate and to the extent permitted by law. These exceptions apply not only to recipients with COVID-19 related Federal financial assistance awards, but also to recipients with assistance awards not related to COVID-19. Specific consideration must be to exceptions that can advance racial equity and support for underserved communities.
